SCHOLARSHIP RULES AND CRITERIA

- 1. Contestants must be an African American Junior or Senior in High School attending one of the twelve designated far South Suburban High Schools, which include: Bloom, Bloom Trail, Crete Monee, Hillcrest, Homewood-Flossmoor, Marian Catholic, Rich Central, and South, Southland College Prep., Thornton, Thornridge, and Thornwood. An Essay Application must be completed and signed by the student.
- 2. Essays are required to be original works, and must have been written within 6 months of the due date.
- 3. The deadline for receipt of all essays is <u>Saturday</u>, <u>April 30</u>, <u>2022</u>. If an essay is mailed and postmarked on that date or before, it will be accepted.
- 4. The cover page of the essay must include the: <u>contestant's name, title of the essay, and date written, each page thereafter must be numbered.</u> Contestants must submit <u>three copies</u> of their essay and sign the last page of each copy.
- 5. The essay must consist of a <u>minimum of (8) eight written pages</u> of text, <u>which does not include the cover page</u>, and a <u>maximum of (12) twelve pages</u>, all <u>double spaced</u> using Times Roman or Courier 12 or 14 font. A <u>Bibliography</u> is required and does not count toward the minimum page requirement.
- 6. Contestants must be prepared to answer questions if asked by one or more judges.
- 7. The Application and the Essay should be sent electronically to <u>WSESF@Comcast.net</u> or mailed to: WSESF, Essay Competition, 262 Main St., Park Forest, IL 60466 and if mailed, post marked on or before <u>Saturday</u>, <u>April 30, 2022</u>.

Essays are judged by the following criteria:

- 1. Creativity and literary expression of subject matter
- 2. Grammar usage, spelling, and overall organization
- 3. Degree of complexity of topic and contestant's knowledge of subject matter
- 4. Credibility of cited resources and research materials
- 5. Quantity of supporting documentation using Footnotes & Bibliography

An essay is an analytic or interpretative literary composition usually dealing with its subject from a limited or personal point of view.

An original essay is the **written expression of its author's opinion**. At best, an essay blends fact with imagination, knowledge, and emotions, never giving itself wholly to one or the other. The essay's purpose is always the same: *to express an opinion about a specific subject*. Therefore, the writer should feel strongly about the topic; one that he or she has experienced, witnessed, or has a serious opinion or interest in the subject.
